An educational evening for prescribers and primary care practitioners with interest in chronic hepatitis B, will be held in Adelaide focusing on managing patients in the primary care setting and the decision to commence a patient on antiviral therapy.



The hepatitis B case discussion evening will be facilitated by a local specialist with expertise in hepatitis B and will take place over an informal dinner.

A range of case studies will be discussed that focus on considerations for starting a patient on treatment. Cases will also reinforce how to best manage a patient already on treatment and how to monitor patients in your care not yet needing treatment.

At the end of this session, participants will be able to:

- Screen at-risk patients, accurately diagnose CHB infection and assess phase of the disease.
- Monitor patients appropriately, establish suitability for treatment
- Discuss aims of treatment, antiviral treatment options, duration of therapy and definitions of response
- Monitor patients on treatment according to established protocols, recognise and manage treatment response, resistance, hepatitis flares and encourage compliance
- Recognise risk factors, clinical signs, symptoms and complications of advanced liver disease and manager or refer to specialist care appropriately

The evening will be presented by **Dr Kate Muller, Gastroenterologist & Hepatologist, Flinders Medical Centre.**
