- Around 50% of all new HIV infections are diagnosed by GPs, however most GPs will have never previously delivered a positive result.
- General practitioners play a crucial role in the Seventh National HIV Strategy goal to virtually eliminate HIV transmission by 2020
- PrEP is a critical component of the HIV prevention landscape and expanding PrEP access to people at a high risk for HIV infection will prevent a significant number of new HIV infections.
- PrEPX SA started on the 15th of May 2017.



The aim of this Dinner is to provide GP's, Nurses and Sexual Health Clinicians an update on strategies available for the prevention of HIV transmission, focusing on prevention particularly pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP).

- Identify priority populations for testing
- Understand HIV epidemiology
- Introduction to HIV treatment
- Comprehend PrEP safety data
- Understand effectiveness of PrEP/PEP
- Explain to patients what PrEP/PEP is and how to access it
